

# AI Transparency Statement

Published September 2026

## 1.1 Purpose

This AI Transparency Statement explains how the National Reconstruction Fund Corporation (**NRFC**) adopts and uses Artificial Intelligence (**AI**).

It has been prepared in accordance with the Standard for AI transparency statements (**v2.0**) published by the Digital Transformation Agency.

## 1.2 How we use AI

In accordance with the DTA's classification system for AI use, the NRFC uses AI within the following domains:

- Compliance and fraud detection;
- Policy and legal; and
- Corporate and enabling.

The NRFC's use of AI falls within the following usage patterns:

- **Workplace productivity**
- **Analytics for insights**
- **Decision making and administrative action** – noting this is limited to supporting decision making or the taking of administrative action by guiding, assessing or making a recommendation to a human decision maker.

The NRFC does not currently use AI in a way that means the public will directly interact with, or be significantly impacted by, AI without a human intermediary or intervention.

## 1.3 Our commitment to ethical and responsible use

The NRFC is committed to leveraging AI in pursuit of its objectives while ensuring its safe, ethical and responsible use that is in line with community expectations.

The NRFC chooses to align its approach with the requirements set out in the Commonwealth Digital Transformation Agency's Policy for the responsible use of AI in government, including by:

- appointing the Head of IT as the NRFC's AI Accountable Officer; and

- publishing this Transparency Statement and ensuring it is updated at least annually.

The NRFC applies governance and risk management processes to the adoption and use of AI, with controls proportionate to the nature, purpose and potential impact of the use. This includes appropriate human oversight and measures to monitor the effectiveness of deployed AI systems and protect against negative impacts.

The NRFC's use of AI is subject to applicable legislation and government policy, including the *Privacy Act 1988* (Cth) and the *Freedom of Information Act 1982* (Cth).
